In October 2007, YATF partnered with the James Creek Resident Council, Friendship House, King-Greenleaf Recreation Center, First Time Computers, the Cavaliers and SWNA board members in creating two computer training programs for Southwest youth whose average ages are from 10-12. The classes are held at James Creek Computer Lab and the King-Greenleaf Recreation Center. Craig is one of three instructors who volunteer their time to teach one hour each week during the eight week

The students, many of whom have not had any previous experience with computers, are provided introductory lessons on how a computer operates, Microsoft Office, and how to safely navigate the internet. PCF Receives DISA Records Management Certification



As briefed in our last newsletter, the DSA CECOM LCMC Acquisition Center team successfully began the roll out of the Paperless Contract Files (PCF) to approximately 350 sites worldwide. As a further update to this effort, the PCF has recently received full DISA Joint Interoperability Test Command (JITC) Records Management Application Certification, a major accomplishment. This enables electronic documents to carry an official "document of record" legal distinction, erasing the need to maintain paper back-up files. Michael C. Doelling, PCF Project Lead, specifically recognized DSA employees Jeannette Schatz, Judy Mercado, Gary Blomquist and Dave Drzygula as demonstrating "true professionalism and outstanding initiative" during the certification process.

The multiple award, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity (ID/IQ) ENCORE II contract provides technical solutions for the Military Services, Department of Defense and other agencies of the Federal Government in support of its migration to an integrated and interoperable Global Information Grid (GIG) and to other Federal agencies having similar Information Technology migration and integration needs. The contract term is ten years, consisting of a five-year base period and five one-year options.

GEMSIS is envisioned to provide end-to-end integration of all electromagnetic spectrum operations, across all functional areas, throughout the entire acquisition and operational life cycle of future Warfighters' capabilities. It will promote the integration of spectrum use across the time domain as well as other Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (C4ISR) and logistics domains. Integration opportunities include enabling command and control (C2) capabilities such as electronic warfare and weapon systems, ISR capabilities such as sensors, network management, and logistics.

To further the program, an Analysis of Alternatives (AoA) must be conducted. The focus of the AoA is to refine the selected concept documented in the approved Initial Capabilities Document (ICD). The AoA will also assess the critical technologies associated with

these concepts, including technology maturity, technical risk, and, if necessary, technology maturation and demonstration needs. It serves as an operational comparison of the operational effectiveness, suitability, and Life-Cycle cost of various alternatives under consideration to meet established capabilities. DSA is proud to have been selected to be part of this vital effort that supports DoD vision into the future.
